Alligators have 4 webbed feet to help them swim in water. Also alligators have 5 toes. Alligators are very fast good swimmers.


Alligators are cold-blooded reptiles.

Hibernation

In winter, when it gets cold an Alligator's body slows down. Alligators do not hibernate. They create a gator hole underwater and dig tunnels in the mud where they sleep, wake up and drink water and sometimes come in the



sun. When spring comes Alligators comes out of their gator hole when the water gets warmer.

<u>Life Span</u>

Alligators can live up to 30 to 50 years.



Weight

Alligators can grow up to I – 8 m and 800 pounds.
