What do Bats Eat?



Bats are insectivores.
They like to eat Beetles,
Moths, Files and
Mosquitoes. Also insects
are their main diet.

Some bats are Frugivores.
They like to eat Pollen
From Flowers, Figs,
Mangoes, Dates and
Bananas. Also Fruits are
their main diet.



<u>Hibernation</u>

In the winter time some Bats move to warmer areas. Some bats hibernate. They can be found in caves, Buildings hanging up side down, curled up like furry little balls.



In the summer time Bats do not hibernate. Bats take a nap hanging up side down under the tree

Life Span

Bats can live 4 to 30 years.

Length and Weight

There are so many different types of bats with different lengths and weights.

Eurasian Noctule Bat is 4 to 5 and a half inches long and weighs a half ounce to I and a half ounces. Their wingspan is 12 to 18 inches.

Little Brown Myotis Bats can be 3 to 4 inches long and weigh up to half an ounce. Their wingspan is about 8 inches.

Fact About Bats

Bats use their hearing for flying and catching insects more than their eyes. This is called echolocation.
