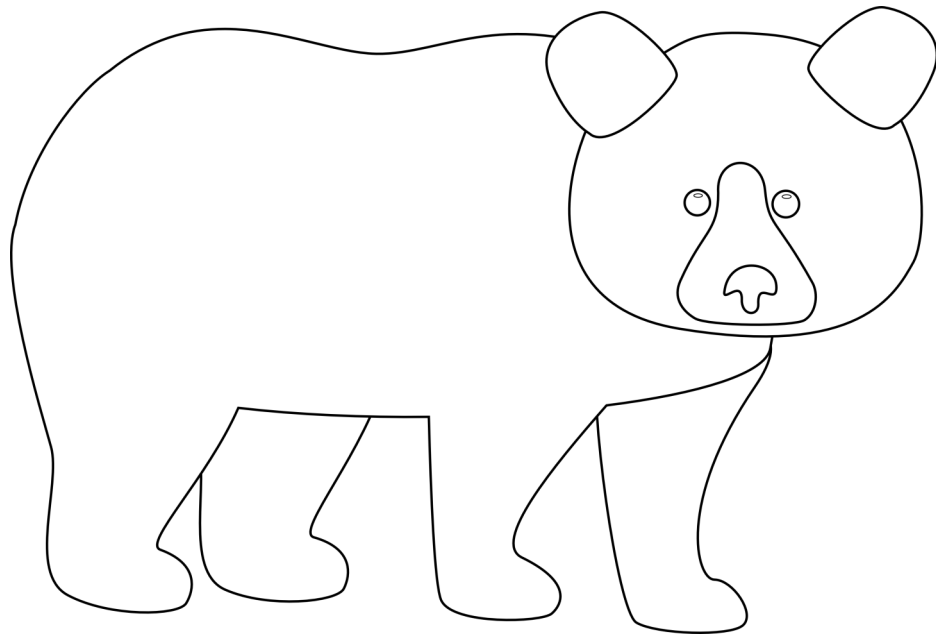

They fall deeply asleep in their dens or caves all winter long.



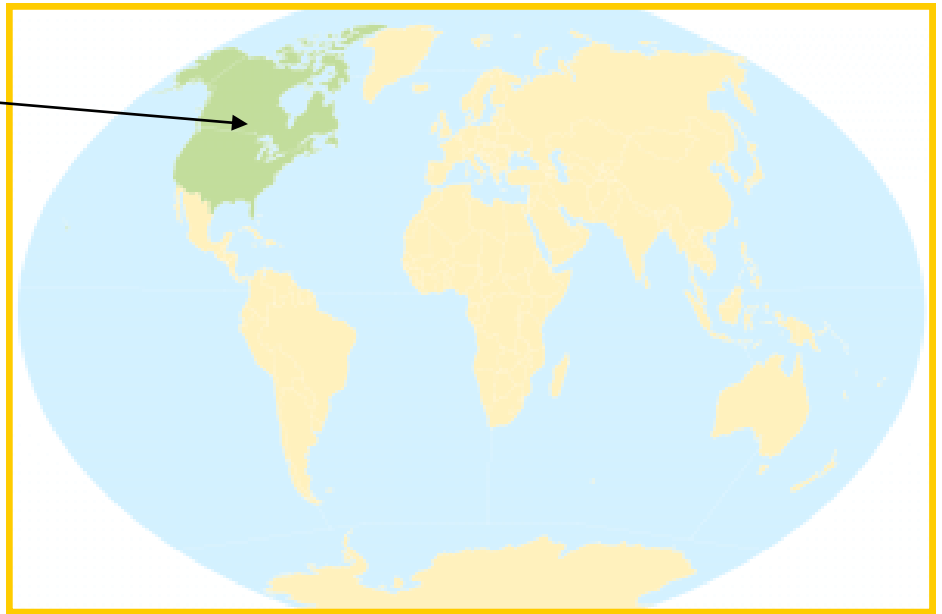
As spring comes, Black Bears wake up from their winter sleep.

What do Black Bears Eat?



Black Bears are omnivorous. They like to eat salmon fish, grasses, berries, deer, herbs, and carrion birds. Plants and meat make up their main diet.

Black Bears travel to the mountains where water is flowing down the hill. It is amazing how all the bears know how to catch salmon fish with their mouth.

Life Span

Black Bears can live up to 30 years in the wild.

Height and Weight

Black Bears can weigh about 200 to 600 pounds.
