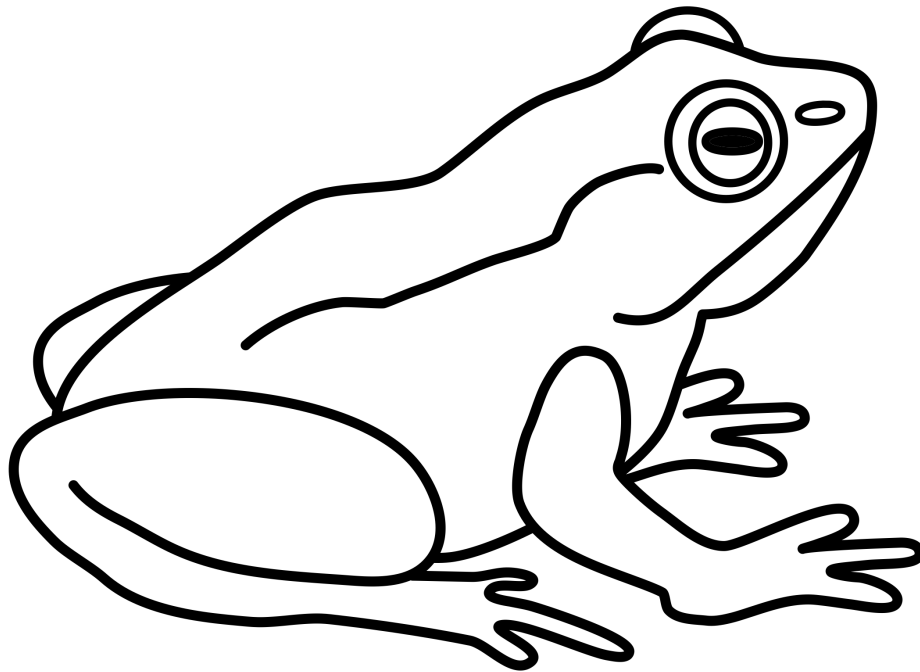

## What do Frogs Eat?



Frogs are carnivores. They like to eat bugs, spiders, worms, small fish, and slugs. Also, insects is their main diet.

## Hibernation

Many frogs survive the winter time through Hibernation, a long deep sleep.

Frogs need to find the perfect place to Hibernate, like at the bottom of the water where they dig deep into the mud to cover themselves with mud through the winter time.



## Weight and Length

Poison Dart Frogs can weigh about 1 ounce and their length is 1 inch.

American Bullfrogs can weigh about 11 pounds and their length is 3.5 to 6 inches.

Red Eye Frogs can weigh about 0.2 to 0.5 ounces and be 0.5 to 2.75 inches long.
